COMMENDABLE RESULTS BY CPS KATOL ROAD STUDENTS IN CBSE AISSCE 2019

Class 12 students of Centre Point School, Katol Road performed extremely well in the CBSE AISSCE results declared on Thursday 2nd May'19. Out of 54 students who appeared in the **Science stream** 17 scored 85% and above. In **Commerce stream** from among 110 students 41 students scored 85% and above. In **Humanities** from among 42 students 24 scored an aggregate of 85% and above.

Anupreeta Datey of 12 Humanities with 97.4% is the school, City & Vidarbha Topper with 100 in Political Science, 100 in History, 99 in Economics, 95 in Mathematics & 93 in English. Lubhna Dongre from the Humanities Stream is the topper with 97% having scored 100 in Psychology.

CPS KATOL ROAD RECEIVES BRITISH COUNCIL'S INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL AWARD

Already a three-time recipient of British Council's International School Award, Centre Point School, Katol Road set off a fourth time on its journey in 2018-19 for ISA. On this journey it partnered with Delta Gemunupura M. V. School, Sri Lanka and collaboratively worked not just on the three collaborative projects but most of the Projects stated in the Action Plan. Schools Online provided the scaffolding in the search and selection of this partnership which is now a sustained one. Keeping in mind the partner school, Centre Pointers discussed, debated and mulled over every aspect of the three collaborative projects and finally shortlisted three projects which were embedded in the curriculum and which the link school also found doable. The Action Plan was drafted and then approved & endorsed. The school started working on the seven projects which spanned the whole school and all age groups. Sharing of



knowledge, skills and attitudes continued consistently between students of both the schools. The collaborative projects took off with swapping videos, images, emails and information. Work started on both ends and Skype sessions played an important role in the interaction between students of both schools.

As the journey through ISA continued the learning outcomes for students were plenty. A true learning outcome of the collaborative projects was that the knowledge received and the information exchanged led to new ways of thinking, applying and creating new things. An example of this was the Project '**Traditional Indoor & Outdoor Games of India and Sri Lanka**' done collaboratively by students of both schools. What is very commendable is that they created a new Board game naming it **Elle Belle Ka Chauka**. The game was appreciated and also uploaded on YouTube. This is only one of the examples of what the students learnt and created. Technology was used innovatively, information was compiled aesthetically, displays & performances were done impressively. For the non-collaborative projects interesting activities including trips & expert talks were conducted. With the students' initiative & the teachers' guidance, the projects were completed and compiled. The slightly different format of compilation did not act as a deterrent for compiling the E-Dossier of evidence.

The assessors awarded cent percent marks to the projects assessed by them. They assessed the e-dossier as **'a very logically arranged, brilliantly put together dossier'**. They commented "The partnership forged by the school during the ISA journey with a school abroad was commendable & noteworthy. Not only the three collaborative projects but also all the other projects are collaborative, taking teaching learning incorporating international dimension, to a higher level". The school is now a recipient of British Council's ISA for 2019-2022. The ISA kite mark which is a key part of the Award is now being used on the school literature, stationery & website. The formal Award ceremony will be held later this year.


